

Kurdish flags

The official flag of the autonomous Kurdistan Region of Iraq features bands of red, white and green and a 21 point yellow star. Forerunners of the flag were used at the Paris Peace Conference in 1919, during the Ararat Republic (1927 – 1930), the Dersim rebellion (1937 – 1938) and the Republic of Mahabad in 1946. Red symbolises blood shed in the struggle for freedom; white symbolises peace, freedom and equality; green symbolises nature and vitality and the 21-point star refers to the ancient Yezidi tradition of rebirth.
